16 Golden Rules

Baha'i Faith: And if thine eyes be turned towards justice, choose thou for thy neighbor that

which thou choosest for thyself.

Buddhism: Treat not others in ways that you yourself would find hurtful.

Christianity: In everything you do, do to others as you would have them do to you; for this

is the law and the prophets.

Confucianism: One word which sums up the basis of all good conduct ... loving kindness. Do

not do to others what you do not want done to yourself.

Hinduism: This is the sum of duty: do not do to others what would cause pain if done to

you.

Humanism: Humanists acknowledge human interdependence, the need for mutual respect

and the kinship of all humanity.

Igbo (Nigeria): We all drink from one cup and eat from one pot.

Islam: Not one of you truly believes until you wish for others what you wish for your-

self.

Jainism: One should treat all creatures in the world as one would like to be treated.

Judaism: What is hateful to you, do not do to your neighbour. This is the whole Torah;

all the rest is commentary.

Spirituality: All things are our relatives; what we do to everything, we do to ourselves. All

is really One.

Shinto: The heart of the person before you is a mirror. See there your own form.
